

## SUNY General Education Approved Courses

Beginning in Fall 2015, all Associate of Arts (A.A.) and Associate of Science (A.S.) degree programs require a minimum of 30 credits of SUNY General Education coursework distributed among a minimum of seven content areas, which must include Mathematics and Basic Communication. Students enrolled in Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) programs who plan to pursue a SUNY baccalaureate degree are advised to choose elective courses that fulfill these General Education requirements where possible. The approved Tompkins Cortland courses for each SUNY knowledge and skill area are shown below.
