Housing Criteria Checklist for RETURNING Students | Fall 2019

This checklist is for students who have a room in campus housing for Spring 2019 and would like to return to on-campus housing for the Fall 2019– Spring 2020 academic year. Housing is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. We will begin to notify returning students about their housing status after Spring 2019 grades are posted and academic standing is determined.

To be offered a room in our residence halls, you must complete ALL of the following criteria AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE (in any order):

CONTRACT

Sign and mail or fax (607.844.6560) your 2019-2020 Residence Hall Contract or you may read, complete and submit your residence hall contract online at TC3.simplecampushousing.com. You will need your myTC3 username and password to use the online form. Parent/guardian signature is required for students under 18 years of age. You do not need to pay a new security deposit. However, you do need to pay for any room damage charges on your spring bill by mid-June. There are financial penalties for breaking the contract between the fall and spring semesters.

NOTE: the contract does not “hold” a room; you must complete ALL the steps on this checklist.

REGISTER

You must be registered for classes for the Fall 2019 semester. Registration begins on Wednesday, April 10.

FINANCIAL HOLD

If there are any financial holds on your account, they must be resolved in order for you to register for Fall 2019 courses and be considered for campus housing. To see your account balance due, go to the Tompkins Cortland Community College home page and select myTC3 from the top. Sign in to myTC3 and then select “myINFO,” then “Finances,” and then “Balance.” Next, select the Period (year/term), the View and then click the “Change” button or contact the Enrollment Services Center.

JUDICIAL HOLD

If there are any judicial holds on your account, you will not be eligible for on-campus housing without prior permission from the Director of Student Conduct and Community Standards.

ACADEMIC PROBATION OR SUSPENSION

If you have met all of the above criteria but are on academic probation or suspension at the end of the Spring 2019 semester, you must complete an academic review and/or suspension appeal before you will be considered for campus housing.

SECURITY DEPOSIT

Pay your \$250 security deposit. You may pay your deposit as soon as you apply to the College. You may pay with cash, check, money order (payable to Tompkins Cortland Community College, Room 101, 170 North St, PO Box 139 Dryden NY 13053), or Visa, Discover or MasterCard. Anticipated financial aid may not be used to pay a security deposit. *NOTE: The security deposit does not “hold” a room. You must complete all of the steps in this checklist to be offered a room in campus housing. It will be refunded if you are not offered a room. Call 607.844.6580 and select option “4” to make a security deposit payment using a credit card.*

PAYMENT

Payment arrangements for tuition, fees, and housing must be in place; either one of the two options below will meet the payment criteria:

Cash, check, money order, VISA, Discover or MasterCard, FACTS Payment Plan and/or third-party payer: Complete and return a Payment Arrangement Form along with a \$2,500 down payment to the Enrollment Services Center, room 101, or phone 607.844.6580 and select option “4”. This can be done any time after you apply to the College. *NOTE: This down payment does not guarantee campus housing and will be refunded if housing is not offered.*

Financial Aid (TAP, Pell, SEOG, student loans, Parent PLUS loans, etc.): If you intend to use any financial aid to help pay your bill, you must file your 2019-2020 FAFSA application and submit any documents required by the Financial Aid Office. File online at www.fafsa.ed.gov using Federal School Code 006788 and www.tapweb.org using TAP School Code 2260. If you have not already filed, please do so immediately. Once the FA Office has reviewed your FAFSA and documents, determined your eligibility and generated an award letter, you will meet the payment arrangement criteria. Please allow 3-4 weeks for this process.

If you require special housing accommodations due to a disability or medical issue, contact the Coordinator of Access and Equity Services at 607.844.8222, Ext. 4283. Accommodations might include assignment to a particular building or apartment, or availability of specialized equipment. Appropriate documentation of disability or medical issue will be required.

*Be One of Us Scholarship - Students receiving a "Be One of Us" Scholarship will receive a scholarship for non-resident tuition but will be required to pay a \$500 fee. See website for more details.

¹ These are ESTIMATED rates; final 2019-2020 tuition and fee rates will be determined in late June 2019.

² Room rates for the 2019-2020 academic year are \$4,200 per semester; \$3,700 with discount.

Break housing has additional costs; see 2019-2020 contract for more details. Room rates include laundry at no additional cost.

³ Meal Plan - Students living in the residence halls are required to purchase, at minimum, the 12 meals/week plan.

The estimated rate for this minimum plan is \$1,450/semester. Meal plans for 14 or 16 meals per week will also be offered.

Additional information will be provided online as meal plan costs and options for the 2019-2020 academic year become finalized.

BOOKS: In addition to the above charges, students should plan to spend \$500 to \$600 per semester for books.

** New York state residents must provide a valid Certificate of Residence to be eligible for NYS resident tuition.
