#### Be One Of Us Scholarship

Non-NYS Residents have the opportunity to pay in state tuition through our Be One of US Scholarship! The Scholarship Program waives the non-resident portion of tuition to support non New-York resident students. This scholarship is administered through the Admissions Office. You must meet the following criteria to continue to qualify for the scholarship:

- Be a current TC3 student
- Maintain a 2.5. GPA
- <u>Live in TC3 Campus Housing during both</u> Fall and Spring semesters of your first year of enrollment at Tompkins Cortland Community College
- Perform and document 15 hours of community service each semester

#### **Living On Campus**

The on campus residence halls are a three-minute walk from campus, providing easy access to classes and other college facilities, such as, the library, pool, and fitness center. The complex offers apartment-style living with a private, locked bedroom for each person, a full kitchen and bath in each apartment, and an active community. Resident Assistants (RAs) and Residence Hall Council offer a variety of activities throughout the semester for students. #### **Living Off Campus**
